John 5:38 and you do not have his word abiding in you, for you do not believe him whom he has sent.

John 6:56 He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him.

John 15:4 Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. 5 I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in me, and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. 6 If a man does not abide in me, he is cast forth as a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into the fire and burned. 7 If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you will, and it shall be done for you.

John 15:9 As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you; abide in my love. **10** If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love.

John 15:16 You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide; so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you.

1 John 2:6 he who says he abides in him ought to walk in the same way in which he walked.

- **1 John 2:10** He who loves his brother abides in the light, and in it there is no cause for stumbling.
- **1 John 2:14** I write to you, fathers, because you know him who is from the beginning. I write to you, young men, because you are strong, and the word of God abides in you, and you have overcome the Evil One.
- **1 John 2:17** And the world passes away, and the lust of it; but he who does the will of God abides for ever.
- **1 John 2:24** Let what you heard from the beginning abide in you. If what you heard from the beginning abides in you, then you will abide in the Son and in the Father.
- 1 John 2:27 but the anointing which you received from him abides in you, and you have no need that any one should teach you; as his anointing teaches you about everything, and is true, and is no lie, just as it has taught you, abide in him. 28 And now, little children, abide in him, so that when he appears we may have confidence and not shrink from him in shame at his coming.
- **1 John 3:6** Any one who abides in him does not sin; any one who sins has not seen him, nor has he known him.
- **1 John 3:9** Any one born of God does not commit sin; for God's seed abides in him, and he cannot sin because he is born of God.
- **1 John 3:15** Any one who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him.
- **1 John 3:17** But if any one has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him?
- **1 John 3:24** All who keep his commandments abide in him, and he in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit which he has given us.
- **1 John 4:12** No man has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and his love is perfected in us. **13** By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his own Spirit.
- 1 John 4:15 Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God. 16 So we know and believe the love God has for us. God is love, and he who abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him.
- **2 John 2** because of the truth which abides in us and will be with us for ever:

2 John 9 Any one who goes ahead and does not abide in the doctrine of Christ does not have God; he who abides in the doctrine has both the Father and the Son.

Important "In Him" Scriptures in 1 John

(without the explicit mention of "abide")

- **1 John 2:5** but whoever keeps his word, in him truly love for God is perfected. By this we may be sure that we are <u>in him</u>:
- **1 John 2:8** Yet I am writing you a new commandment, which is true in him and in you, because the darkness is passing away and the true light is already shining.
- **1 John 2:15** Do not love the world or the things in the world. If any one loves the world, love for the Father is not in him.
- **1 John 5:20** And we know that the Son of God has come and has given us understanding, to know him who is true; and we are <u>in him</u> who is true, in his Son Jesus Christ. This is the true God and eternal life.

Key Words Related to Abiding in Christ and Union with Christ

Gk. koinōnía = fellowship = participation = union = mutual indwelling

Gk. koinōnos = partner = sharer (word related to koinōnía)

- **1 John 1:3** that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you may have fellowship with us; and our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ.
- **1 John 1:6** If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not live according to the truth; **7** but if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin.

The bond that unites Christians begins with the living union (**koinōnía**) with the Father and the Son. This life-giving and life-sharing bond could be called "the key to the successful Christian life" in the first and twenty-first centuries. This isn't just a fact for theology books. Rather, it's meant to be **an experienced** reality for all Christians.

1 Peter 1:3 His divine power has granted to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of him who called us to his own glory and excellence, 4 by which he has granted to us his precious and very great promises, so that through them you may

become <u>partakers</u> (*koinōnos*) of the divine nature, having escaped from the corruption that is in the world because of sinful desire.

Merriam-Webster English definition of koinonia

- 1. The Christian fellowship or body of believers
- 2. Intimate spiritual communion and participative sharing in a common religious commitment and spiritual community

Etymology

Greek koinōnia communion, association, partnership, from koinos common
